Lesson 1 – “Nice to Meet You”	Greetings and introductions	Grammar: to be (affirmative/negative/questions), subject pronouns, like and dislike Vocab: greetings.	1. “I’m from Vietnam.” 2. “Are you a teacher?” 3. “She isn’t from Japan.”
Lesson 2 – “Home Sweet Home”	Talking about your house or apartment	Grammar: There is / There are, a/an, prepositions of place. Vocab: rooms, furniture, household items. Pronunciation: Linking sounds and contractions	1. “There’s a sofa in my living room.” 2. “There are three windows.” 3. “The TV is next to the bed.”
Lesson 3 – “A Day in My Life”	Daily routine and frequency	Grammar: Present simple + adverbs of frequency (always, sometimes, never). Vocab: routine verbs, time expressions.	1. “I usually get up at 7 o’clock.” 2. “He never drinks coffee.” 3. “Do you work on weekends?”
Lesson 4 – “Out and About”	Around town and giving directions	Grammar: Imperatives (+/-), prepositions of movement. Vocab: places in town, park, post office, opposite, between, turn left/right.	1. “Go straight ahead.” 2. “Turn right at the bank.” 3. “Don’t cross the road here.”
Lesson 5 – “Eating Out”	Ordering food and expressing likes	Grammar: I’d like, countable/uncountable nouns, some/any. Vocab: food and drink, restaurant language, polite requests.	1. “I’d like some chicken, please.” 2. “Do you have any water?” 3. “She doesn’t like spicy food.”
Lesson 6 – “What Are You Doing?”	Talking about actions now	Grammar: Present continuous (+/-/?), stative vs active verbs. Vocab: activities, verbs of motion, time markers (now, right now). Pronunciation: -ing endings.	1. “I’m watching TV.” 2. “She isn’t working now.” 3. “Are they studying English?”
Lesson 7 – “Let’s Go Shopping”	Shopping and prices	Grammar: How much / How many, quantifiers, this/that/these/those. Vocab: shopping items, money, numbers and prices.	1. “How much is this T-shirt?” 2. “There aren’t many apples.” 3. “These shoes are very cheap.”
Lesson 8 – “Good Times”	Hobbies, interests, and ability	Grammar: like / love / hate + verb-ing, can/can’t for ability. Vocab: hobby verbs and free-time activities. Pronunciation: long vs short vowels.	1. “I love playing football.” 2. “She can play the guitar.” 3. “He can’t swim very well.”
Lesson 9 – “Yesterday”	Talking about past events	Grammar: Past simple (regular and irregular verbs), past of to be. Vocab: time expressions (yesterday, last week, ago), verbs of daily life.	1. “I went to the beach yesterday.” 2. “We were tired after the trip.” 3. “Did you watch the movie?”
Lesson 10 – “Weather & Seasons”	Talking about the weather and comparisons	Grammar: Comparatives and superlatives, It’s + adj. Vocab: weather, seasons, temperature. Pronunciation: ending sounds /s/ /z/ /iz/.
