Lesson 7 – Future Paradoxes	Time and predictions	Vocab: Time expressions and futurist vocabulary (e.g., obsolete, imminent, in the fullness of time). Analyze past "visions of the future" and discuss why they succeeded or failed.	Grammar: Future-in-the-past (e.g., was going to, was to have been) and 'would' for past habits. Guided Discovery Describe your "current" habits from the perspective of the year 2050.	By the end of this lesson, you will be able to discuss chronological paradoxes and time-based habits with structural accuracy.
Lesson 8 – The Ethics of Choice	Dilemmas and conditions	Vocab: Ethical terminology and philosophical concepts (e.g., utilitarian, compromise, untenable). Debate modern ethical dilemmas like AI and data privacy using high-level logic.	Grammar: Alternatives to 'If' (e.g., Supposing, Had it not been for, Provided that, Unless). Guided Discovery Negotiate a multi-party international agreement where every "yes" is tied to a strict condition.	By the end of this lesson, you will be able to express conditions and hypothetical ethical stances in formal debate settings.
Lesson 9 – Peak Performance	Mastery and workflows	Vocab: Sports and performance idioms (e.g., to be in the zone, gain traction, the ball's in your court). Interview a peer about their "flow state" and productivity habits.	Grammar: Phrasal Verbs: Transitivity and Separability (focusing on advanced usage). Guided Discovery Conduct a "Productivity Audit" of a professional workflow using phrasal verbs accurately in context.	By the end of this lesson, you will be able to discuss professional excellence and technical workflows using idiomatic phrasal verbs.
Lesson 10 – Persuasive Speaker	Rhetoric and impact	Vocab: Rhetorical devices and persuasive markers (e.g., paradoxically, with all due respect, it follows that). Analyze a famous speech to identify how the speaker creates rhythm and mystery.	Grammar: Ellipsis and Substitution (avoiding repetition for impact). Guided Discovery Deliver a 3-minute persuasive "Keynote" using all the rhetorical devices mastered in Level 5.	By the end of this lesson, you will be able to deliver a sophisticated, persuasive presentation using high-level rhetorical features.
